

## A Letter from Fr. Patrick Kizza

November 30, 2025

#### The Advent Season: A Journey of Hope and Preparation

The Advent season is a cherished time in the Christian calendar, inviting believers into a period of quiet expectation and joyful preparation. Occurring in the four weeks leading up to Christmas, Advent serves as both a spiritual journey and a heartfelt reminder of the true meaning behind the celebration of Christ's birth. As we journey through Advent, we are invited to look both backward and forward—remembering the humble arrival of Jesus in Bethlehem and anticipating His promised return. This dual focus gives the season its depth and meaning, grounding our celebrations in faith and renewing our sense of purpose.

In a fast-paced world, Advent offers a much-needed moment of stillness. It teaches us to hope when days are dark, to trust when life feels uncertain, and to love more deeply in every season. As the candles glow brighter each week, may our hearts also grow in expectation, ready to welcome the peace and joy that Christ brings.







Dear Friends,

I am pleased to share the Annual Financial Report for Parish Operations for the fiscal year that began July 1, 2024 and ended June 30, 2025. It tells a story of your generosity and our effort to be good stewards.

You will notice that we separate ordinary and extraordinary items. I will explain below why this is important. Our overall financial position is strong. Our balance sheet is solid and we have no debt. St. Patrick ended its fiscal year with an increase in Net Income of \$234,151, an improvement of \$79,744 from the previous fiscal year.

However, the loss from Operations totaled \$204,201 reflecting moderate progress from the previous year. What this means is that the cost of keeping our parish open and available is greater than the money received from our regular (ordinary) sources of income.

Total Receipts from Operations were \$1,182,910 reflecting an increase of \$19,204. This is primarily due to improved offertory collections for which we are grateful. The parish was able to hold the line on expenses. Total Payments of \$1,387,111 reflect a decrease of \$67,437 in this category. Despite this improvement, the parish suffered an Operating Loss as noted above.

Special Receipts less Special Payments totaled \$438,352 a decrease of \$6,897 from the prior year. Although important these special or extraordinary receipts and payments are not part of the parish's day-to-day financial operations. The increase in Special Receipts was driven by your generous donations to our Sharing Parish and to the Archdiocese's Special Collections while gains in interest income and mutual funds were realized. The \$110,599 increase in Special Payments stems from funds shared with our Sharing Parish and required Archdiocesan Collections as well as Capital Improvement expenditures relating to the refurbishment of the main church.

Cash and Investments totaled \$3,893,540, an increase over last year of \$232,731, as the parish was a beneficiary of the estates of two long-time, loyal parishioners. The parish's financial assets were used to cover its losses from ordinary Operations both this year and last. Looking ahead, the parish will likely use these assets to fund future capital improvements as well.

While St. Patrick Church has financial assets, they are designated for specific uses related primarily to extraordinary maintenance and upkeep of our church buildings and rectory. Some of these uses would include tuck pointing, replacement of mechanical systems, roofing, etc. By growing financial assets, we generate funds to finance extraordinary expenses. Continued reliance on financial assets to cover operating losses is not a good strategy. It is time to reverse what has been a multi-year trend.

During the remaining months of this current fiscal year, I request that all of us focus on increasing the Sunday and Holy Day Collections. As the cost of running our parish increases, so must our revenues. The most direct way to do this is for each one of us to prayerfully consider increasing our regular Sunday offering, especially if it has been some time since you have done so. Please search your heart to see if this is something you can do.

I would like to thank each of you for your loyal, generous, and continued support of our parish and our priests through the years. I also thank the Parish Pastoral Council, the Parish Finance Council, the Parish Staff, and the many other groups and individuals who support the parish and its ministries in many different ways.
