A Faith That Perseveres: Praying for Our Young People

Yesterday, August 15, we celebrated the beautiful Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, honoring Mary, who, according to the Church's teaching, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory at the end of her earthly life. Her Assumption reminds us that our earthly journey leads to a heavenly destination. We were not created merely to succeed in this world; we were created for eternal life with God. Mary shows us how to remain faithful to God throughout life, trusting Him even when the path is difficult or uncertain. As we celebrate this great feast, we are reminded that our young people are also on a journey. Their education, friendships, decisions, struggles, and dreams are all part of a greater path on which we pray they will discover and faithfully live the vocation God has given each of them.

Beginning this week and in the weeks ahead, our children, young adults, and students at every level will return to their schools, colleges, and universities. This is an important time for them and for us as parents, grandparents, families, and a parish community. Today's Gospel offers the powerful example of a mother who would not give up while her daughter was suffering. The Canaanite woman came to Jesus and cried, "Lord, help me." Even when she faced what seemed like silence and rejection, she persisted. Her faith was so strong that Jesus said to her, "O woman, great is your faith!" Her perseverance reminds us that one of the greatest gifts we can give our young people is not only advice or material support, but steadfast prayer.

As our young people return to school, let us pray that they remain rooted in the faith they have received from their families and our parish community. The world will present them with many voices, ideas, pressures, and distractions. May they have the wisdom to recognize what draws them closer to God and the courage to turn away from what leads them from Him. May they resist worldly pressures and remain focused, resilient, and confident in who God created them to be. May they discover their gifts and use them not only for personal success, but also in service to God and others.

Parents and grandparents, please continue praying for your children. When you cannot be physically present, your prayers can reach places you cannot. Pray for them as they leave home each morning, face difficult decisions, experience loneliness, make mistakes, and celebrate successes. Like the Canaanite woman, never stop bringing your children before Jesus and saying, "Lord, help me." As a parish family, let us surround our young people with encouragement, prayer, and faithful examples of Christian living. May Mary, our Mother and Queen of Heaven, watch over them, protect them, and lead them always closer to her Son.

As we begin another school year, may our prayer be simple and persistent: Lord, guide our young people, protect them from anything that may lead them away from You, strengthen them when they are discouraged, give them wisdom in their decisions, and help them become the people You have called them to be. May their education shape not only their minds, but also their hearts, so that wherever they go, they may carry Christ with them. Amen.

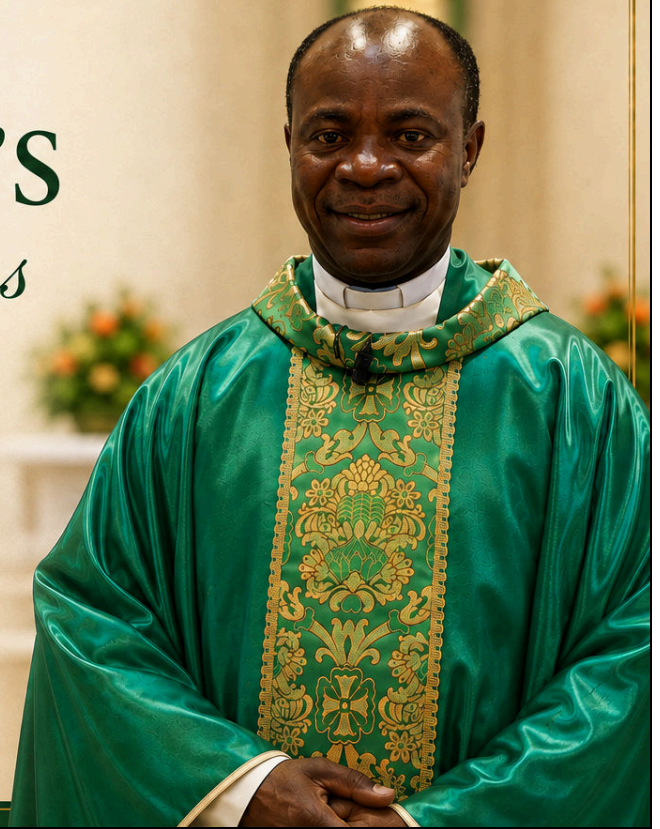

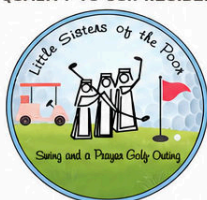

Religious Education Registration

2026–2027 School Year | Grades 1 through Confirmation

Classes start in September. Register soon. Some classes are filling up.

Help your child grow in faith, deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ, and build a strong foundation in the Catholic faith.

Classes meet Sundays 8:30–9:45 AM or Mondays 4:30–5:45 PM.

IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- A Baptismal Certificate is required to submit registration.
- Tuition: 1 child \$375 | 2 children \$600 | 3 or more children \$675
- 2nd Grade Sacrament Fee: additional \$60
- Early Bird pricing ends July 1. After that, fees increase by \$100 per family.
- Tuition assistance is available. No child will be denied enrollment because of financial hardship.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Students preparing for First Communion and Confirmation must be enrolled in the program for two years before receiving the sacrament.

Confirmation begins in grade 8 at the earliest.

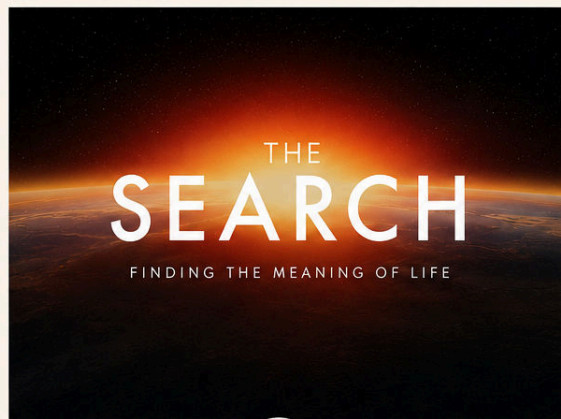
