

A Letter from Fr. Patrick Kizza

November 23, 2025

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

The Solemnity of Christ the King invites us to look upon the most unexpected throne in human history: a cross. As rulers mock Him, soldiers jeer, and bystanders challenge His identity, Jesus reveals the deepest truth about His kingship, not a power that dominates, but a love that sacrifices. The world recognizes kings by crowns of gold, armies, and authority. But on Calvary, we meet a King who rules by mercy, who refuses to save Himself so that He might save us.

We see this same contrast in daily life. Consider a person who has been wronged harsh words from a coworker, a broken promise from a friend. One path resembles the first criminal: responding with bitterness, retaliation, or mockery. The other path imitates Christ the King: responding with patient love, refusing to "come down from the cross" of fidelity and charity. When parents choose gentleness instead of anger, when a spouse chooses forgiveness instead of resentment, when a Christian admits their faults and asks for grace—they reveal the kingdom Christ brings.

Luke's Gospel gives us a profound model in the Good Thief, traditionally known as St. Dismas. While one criminal echoes the world's logic "Save yourself!", the other sees what the powerful cannot: an innocent King whose authority is mercy. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." At this simple plea, Jesus opens the gates of Paradise. Pope Benedict XVI once wrote that the Good Thief "shows us the courage to trust even at the very end," reminding us that Christ's kingdom is always near, especially for those who turn toward Him in humility.

Christian writers throughout the centuries remind us that Christ's kingship is not imposed but offered. St. Augustine teaches that Christ reigns first in the hearts of those who believe, a kingdom formed by truth and charity rather than territory. C. S. Lewis adds in *Mere Christianity* that real allegiance to Christ the King shapes every corner of our lives, "not simply a part but the whole." When we allow Christ to reign in our speech, our choices, our relationships, and our priorities, His kingdom becomes visible in the world.

The Solemnity of Christ the King reminds us that Jesus' authority is grounded in self-emptying love. His crown is thorns, His scepter a reed, His throne a cross. Yet from that cross, He pronounces the most royal of decrees: mercy. And in doing so, He reveals a kingdom that cannot be defeated, because it is built not on force, but on the everlasting fidelity of God.

Today, may we echo the prayer of the Good Thief: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And may we recognize His kingdom already breaking into our lives—in acts of patience, compassion, courage, and love. For this King does not wait for the powerful; He comes to the humble. He comes to us.





Dear Friends,

I am pleased to share the Annual Financial Report for Parish Operations for the fiscal year that began July 1, 2024 and ended June 30, 2025. It tells a story of your generosity and our effort to be good stewards.

You will notice that we separate ordinary and extraordinary items. I will explain below why this is important. Our overall financial position is strong. Our balance sheet is solid and we have no debt. St. Patrick ended its fiscal year with an increase in Net Income of \$234,151, an improvement of \$79,744 from the previous fiscal year.

However, the loss from Operations totaled \$204,201 reflecting moderate progress from the previous year. What this means is that the cost of keeping our parish open and available is greater than the money received from our regular (ordinary) sources of income.

Total Receipts from Operations were \$1,182,910 reflecting an increase of \$19,204. This is primarily due to improved offertory collections for which we are grateful. The parish was able to hold the line on expenses. Total Payments of \$1,387,111 reflect a decrease of \$67,437 in this category. Despite this improvement, the parish suffered an Operating Loss as noted above.

Special Receipts less Special Payments totaled \$438,352 a decrease of \$6,897 from the prior year. Although important these special or extraordinary receipts and payments are not part of the parish's day-to-day financial operations. The increase in Special Receipts was driven by your generous donations to our Sharing Parish and to the Archdiocese's Special Collections while gains in interest income and mutual funds were realized. The \$110,599 increase in Special Payments stems from funds shared with our Sharing Parish and required Archdiocesan Collections as well as Capital Improvement expenditures relating to the refurbishment of the main church.

Cash and Investments totaled \$3,893,540, an increase over last year of \$232,731, as the parish was a beneficiary of the estates of two long-time, loyal parishioners. The parish's financial assets were used to cover its losses from ordinary Operations both this year and last. Looking ahead, the parish will likely use these assets to fund future capital improvements as well.

While St. Patrick Church has financial assets, they are designated for specific uses related primarily to extraordinary maintenance and upkeep of our church buildings and rectory. Some of these uses would include tuck pointing, replacement of mechanical systems, roofing, etc. By growing financial assets, we generate funds to finance extraordinary expenses. Continued reliance on financial assets to cover operating losses is not a good strategy. It is time to reverse what has been a multi-year trend.

During the remaining months of this current fiscal year, I request that all of us focus on increasing the Sunday and Holy Day Collections. As the cost of running our parish increases, so must our revenues. The most direct way to do this is for each one of us to prayerfully consider increasing our regular Sunday offering, especially if it has been some time since you have done so. Please search your heart to see if this is something you can do.

I would like to thank each of you for your loyal, generous, and continued support of our parish and our priests through the years. I also thank the Parish Pastoral Council, the Parish Finance Council, the Parish Staff, and the many other groups and individuals who support the parish and its ministries in many different ways.
