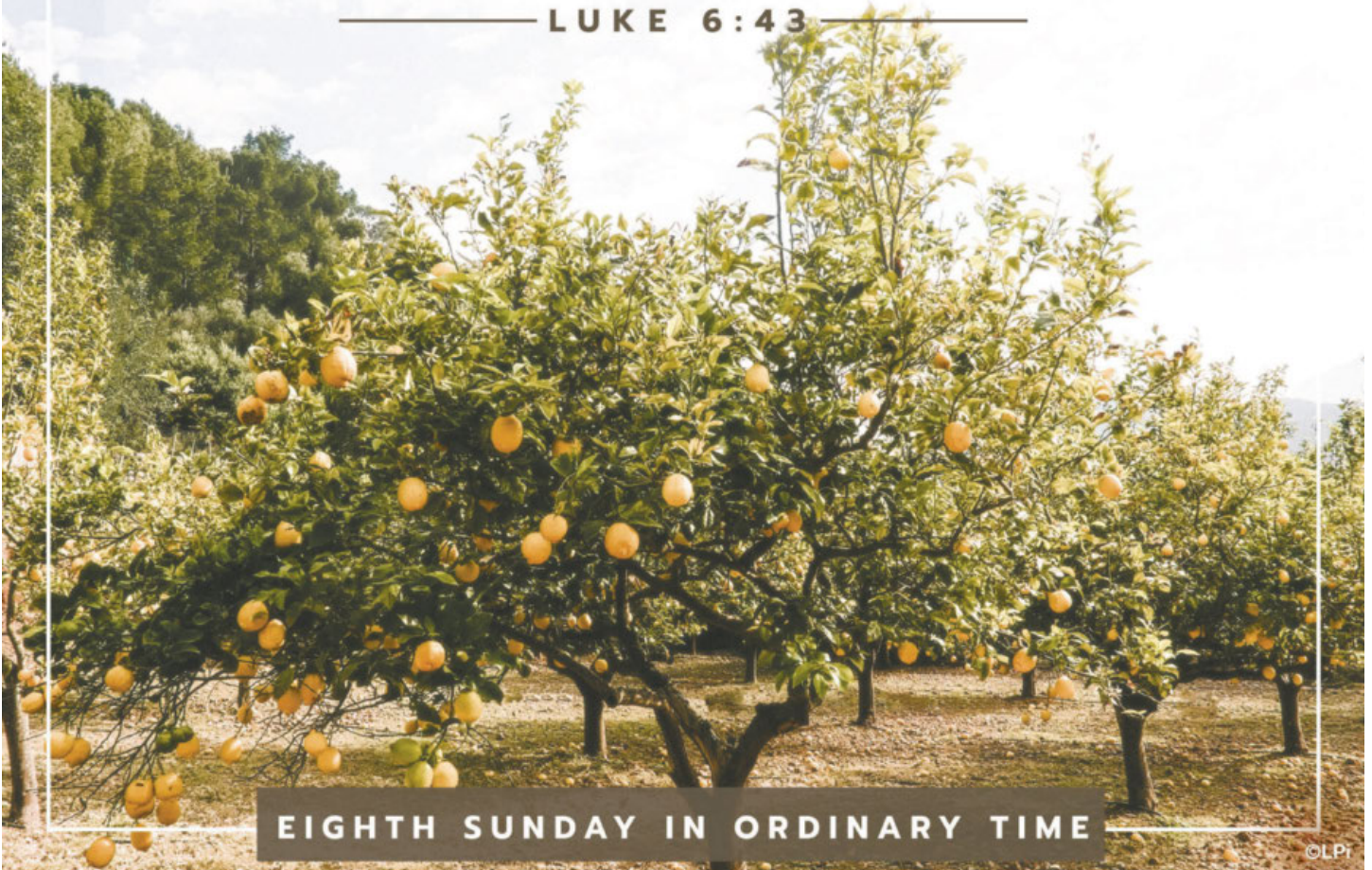

Dear Friends,

The Religious Education Program will host the 10 AM Mass next Sunday, March 9. I hope this will give the Religious Ed program more of a spotlight as an important ministry of our parish. I want to thank Brandin Stoy, Yasmin Alba, Dawn Isaia, the catechists, and the parents who have prepared the students for full participation in the Mass. Your presence at Sunday Mass is a blessing. Remember: we go to God together!

We are celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the 10 AM Mass today. We offer our prayerful support to those weakened by ailments or age. After the homily those wishing to be anointed will be called forth. After hands are imposed, the forehead and the palms of both hands are anointed; the priest says, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." The recipient says "Amen" to each anointing prayer.

Today we also have been asked to follow up on the Annual Catholic Appeal. Thank you for your participation in the last few weeks in the Appeal. 
### **Lenten Practices**

The distribution of Ashes will take place on Wednesday, March 5, at Masses at 8 AM and 6:30 PM and at a prayer service at noon. All liturgies will be held in the main church. Catholics ages 18–59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating one full meal and two smaller meals that don't add up to a full meal. Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. When a dispensation is given from fasting and abstaining it is assumed that some form of penance will be observed at another time. There are many forms of penance besides simpler meals. Abstaining from smartphone scrolling, media immersion, and avoiding gossip are all acts of fasting that express the spirit of Lent. Practicing healthy food choices, a set time of silent prayer, or thanking and affirming others are positive practices to replace what is "given up." Stations of the Cross will take place at 4:00 PM on the Fridays of Lent. Little black books will also be available.

### **Almsgiving**

Fr. Wilfred has returned to Zambia to continue his work of evangelizing and human development. Thank you for giving him such a warm welcome. As a communal act of almsgiving during Lent, you are invited to make a contribution to Friends of Chikwa parish, a qualified 501 C 3 not-for-profit organization. ## RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE

Decades ago, the bishops of the United States established a program to aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe and help it rebuild after decades of communist oppression. The program is funded by an annual collection taken up in dioceses across the United States. That response continues today, even as the rebuilding Church faces the new challenges of war and the mass migration of refugees.

From the beginning of the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 and the subsequent war, the Catholic Church has vigorously responded to the ongoing humanitarian catastrophe by offering shelter, food, medicine, and necessities—as well as spiritual support and comfort—to displaced persons and other war victims. Among those leading this charitable response are the consecrated religious sisters and brothers of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. Whether by providing shelter and basic necessities to internally displaced persons who have fled their homes for safety in other regions of the country, or by helping priests provide pastoral and humanitarian support in areas where the fighting is most heavy, these sisters and brothers have truly showed Christ's mercy to those most in need.

For them, the human suffering of war is compounded by the unique challenges that wartime conditions present for them as consecrated religious. Questions of how religious communities balance ministry to the needy with the sisters and brothers' needs to live their vows of prayer and community under such extraordinary circumstances require thoughtful responses.

Aided by funding from the collection, the Patriarchal Curia of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church gathered sisters, brothers, and their superiors for the spiritual renewal of a pilgrimage as well as formation sessions to address the challenges facing their communities. Your support for the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe is a vital way for you to make a tangible difference in the lives of Catholics in Ukraine and more than 25 other countries in Central and Eastern Europe.

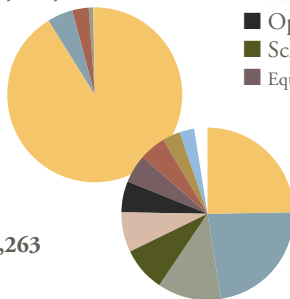

# The Eucharist in Scripture

## Sacrifice, Meal, Communion

**Spring 2025: March 13 - April 24**

The word “Eucharist” is a familiar word to Catholic Christians, but how often do we stop and reflect on what the word means -- especially what it means in our everyday lives? Are we able to explain to our friends who are not Catholic what the “Real Presence” of Jesus in the Eucharist means? When the priest celebrating Mass proclaims “the Mystery of Faith” during the Eucharistic Prayer, do we realize that the priest is referring to the entire mystery of salvation achieved through Christ’s death, resurrection, and ascension which is “re-presented” in the celebration of the Eucharist?

This spring, the Thursday Morning Scripture Group will read passages in Scripture that will help to deepen our understanding of the Eucharist. We will look at texts in both the Old and New Testaments that reveal that the Eucharist is a multi-faceted Mystery that can be pondered as sacrifice, meal, and communion. The 7-week spring session will begin on March 13.

The Thursday Morning Scripture Group has been meeting at St. Patrick’s since 2001 and is led by parishioner Susan Carlson, who holds a Master of Divinity degree. The group’s approach to the Scriptures is to combine study, prayer, reflection, and small group discussion. The group meets from 9:30 until 11:00 a.m. on Thursday in the O’Gara Parish Activity Center. No previous Bible study experience is required – please join us!

In addition to the Bible, the group will use a Threshold Bible Study Commentary, *The Eucharist*, by Stephen Binz. The fee to participate is \$15, which covers the cost of the commentary. 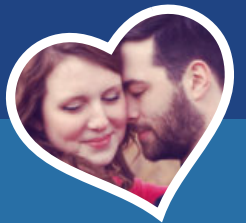
