From The Desk of Fr. Patrick

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred time in the Christian journey, as we reflect on the Passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On this day, we remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem in humility, riding on a donkey, while the crowds welcomed Him with great enthusiasm. They spread cloaks on the road, waved palm branches, and cried out with joy, "*Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!*" (cf. Gospel of Matthew 21:9).

Yet the same voices that shouted "Hosanna," would only days later cry out, "*Crucify him! Crucify him!*" This dramatic shift reveals the weakness and inconsistency of the human heart. The people welcomed Jesus when they expected a powerful earthly king, someone who would fulfill their desires and bring immediate change. But when Jesus did not meet their expectations, when He spoke of sacrifice, humility, and the cross, they turned against Him.

Palm Sunday is not just a story about people long ago; it is a mirror of our own lives. How often do we praise God when things go well, and then turn away when life becomes difficult? How often do we say "Hosanna" in moments of blessing, but "Crucify Him" through our actions when we ignore His teachings, fail to forgive, or choose comfort over faithfulness?

This day invites us to examine our relationship with Christ. Are we followers only in moments of joy, or also in moments of sacrifice? True discipleship means walking with Jesus not only in celebration, but also on the road to Calvary. It means remaining faithful when it is easy and when it is difficult.

Despite the rejection He faced, Jesus continued His journey to the cross out of love. He knew the crowd would turn against Him, yet He did not turn away from them. His love is constant, faithful, and unconditional. As Scripture reminds us, "*God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us*" (cf. Epistle to the Romans 5:8).

As we enter Holy Week, Palm Sunday challenges us to move beyond superficial faith. It calls us to deeper commitment, to stand with Christ not only in moments of praise but also in moments of trial. Let us ask for the grace to be faithful disciples, steadfast in love, strong in faith, and willing to carry our crosses.

May this Palm Sunday transform our hearts, so that our "Hosanna" is not just a passing emotion, but a lifelong commitment to follow Christ wherever He leads, even to the cross, trusting that beyond it lies the glory of the resurrection.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. What Sunday is to the week, the solemnity of Easter is to the liturgical year. [General Norms of the Liturgical Year, #18)

Lent ends quietly on Thursday afternoon. The Church enters the Triduum (“three days”). On Thursday night the Church begins a time of prayer and fasting, a time of keeping watch, that lasts into the great Vigil between Saturday and Sunday. The Church emphasizes that the fasting of Good Friday and, if possible, of Holy Saturday are integral to the keeping of these days and the preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation celebrated at the Vigil. On Thursday night and on Friday afternoon, the Church gathers to pray and to remember the many facets of the single mystery.



THE PROMISE

Our Lord Jesus said, “The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates throughout which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.”

— Saint Faustina, Diary, 699

WHY IS THIS PROMISE FROM JESUS SO WONDERFUL AND MERCIFUL?

TEMPORAL PUNISHMENT AND SUFFERING:

The Catholic Church teaches that sin has two consequences, or punishments. (CCC 1472). The first is eternal punishment in which the soul loses Heaven and is confined to an eternity in Hell. This punishment is remitted through the forgiveness of sins. The second is temporal punishment, in which a person must expiate, or make reparation for his sins. This temporal punishment remains even after sin is forgiven. This temporal punishment is known as Purgatory.

So, Jesus’s amazing promise to St. Faustina amounts to offering all mankind the graces of a COMPLETE PARDON; an opportunity to have all temporal punishment, time in Purgatory, that which would be necessary before entrance into Heaven, completely removed!

THE DIVINE MERCY FEAST DAY

“I desire that there be a feast of mercy. I want this image, which you will paint with a brush to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be known as the Feast of Mercy.”

THE IMAGE

“I desire that this image be venerated throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I promise victory over its enemies, already here on earth, and especially at the hour of death... I Myself will defend it as My own glory.”

THE CHAPLET

“Pray unceasingly the Chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation.”

THE CONVERSION PRAYER

“If you say this prayer, with a contrite heart and with faith, on behalf of some sinner, I will give that soul the grace of conversion:

‘O Blood and Water that gushed forth from the heart of Jesus, as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.’


