The Rosary and the Family Fr. Charlie McCoy, C.S.C.

There are many religious orders associated with the Rosary, most notably the Dominicans, who have fostered this devotion as part of their evangelization

efforts for 800 years. But if one were to identify a single figure as "the Rosary priest," that man would probably be Venerable Fr. Patrick Peyton, a member of my religious order, the Congregation of Holy Cross. From the 1940's to the early 1990's, through radio, television, film and his famous "Rosary Rallies" across the globe, Fr. Peyton encouraged millions of families to grow closer to Jesus Christ through His Blessed Mother and this favored prayer.

Fr. Peyton did not develop his commitment to the Rosary during his seminary formation or even in his childhood parish education in Ireland. Instead, young Patrick Peyton, like countless Irish Catholics before him, learned the Rosary as a family devotion that his parents and siblings gathered to pray together each evening. So ingrained was the family Rosary in Patrick that, when as a teenage laborer he boarded with a family who did not pray the Rosary together, he found the courage to gently but strongly challenge the father of this family to take up this practice! (The father eventually heeded young Patrick's spiritual counsel.)

How beautiful that Fr. Peyton, following his national tradition, associated the Rosary with the family. For, indeed, the Rosary truly invites us into the family life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, especially in the Joyful and Glorious Mysteries. And, Providentially, the Church's calendar strengthens and deepens this connection. Since October 7 is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, the Church particularly emphasizes this prayer throughout the entire month. And, in the American Church, October is also Respect Life month, when we focus intently on the sanctity of pre-born children and our Christian responsibility to support them and their mothers and fathers. How awesome that the first three Joyful Mysteries highlight this very truth, by recognizing how the Eternal Son of God became the flesh and blood Son of Mary and the adopted Son of St. Joseph.

Then, as October draws to a close, the Church immediately celebrates the Saints, the remembrance of the dead, and the family bonds that endure into Eternity. How fitting, then, that the Church's great October prayer closes with the Glorious Mysteries of Mary's Assumption and Crowning. For here we meditate on the full reunion of Son and Mother. Here we envision Mary, by virtue of her special role in salvation, enjoying in anticipation what all the Saints are promised – full Communion in the Lord, full participation in the Family of God. O Mary, Mother of the Church, O Mary, Queen of families, pray for us!

I am grateful that my brother shared this beautiful reflection to continue to encourage us to intercede for our loved ones by praying the Rosary. In the coming weeks we will have special opportunities for you to connect with the person you are praying for, more details to come! The Eucharistic Revival Team will continue to have a table in the back of the Church with information, books and rosaries. We hope to continue to inspire you on your Walk with One journey. Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us!
